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## The Mission of Jesus (2)

Saint Michael Garicoits tells us that "Our Lord had a spirit of gentleness, humility and commitment, not to punish or confound, but to win us to repentance and the imitation of Him" (M. 323, MS 203). This helps us to better know and live the Gospel as the founder understood so well. Jesus calls us to repentance to be and to live in his image, so that we can live in the love of Father and son, in the Son.

Jesus succinctly describes his mission when he proclaims in the synagogue of Nazareth, the lines from Isaiah 61: 1-2, adding that, "today this is being fulfilled even as you listen" (Lk 4: 16-24).

He was consecrated in the Spirit and sent by the Father to proclaim the Good News to the poor, liberty to captives and sight to the blind, to give freedom to the oppressed, and to proclaim a year of favour from the Lord.

This meant going out to meet people, getting to know their needs, their sorrows and hurts, to comfort them, give them understanding, help and joy. It meant



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restoring the condition of the people by announcing the love that God has for them. This sums up what Christ did in the Gospel, effecting the healing which is salvation. The parable of the Good Samaritan well expresses tenderness that Jesus lived in his mission.

Saint Michael Garicoits also lived this tenderness as a feature of his mission: "What do we preach about our Lord? Tenderness at all times: in his incarnation, his holy childhood, his passion, his Sacred Heart, in his outward life and inward grace, in his words and in his eyes ... So what should be the main charactistic of our spiritual life? Christian tenderness! Without it, we cannot possess the spirit of generosity to serve God. It is necessary for both our inner life, in our relationship with God as well as in our outer life and our relationships to men."(MS 200).

The first trait of Jesus' temperament is to let himself be touched by the plight of individuals, to have compassion on the crowd, the bereaved mother of the young man of Nain, the Good Thief. He is not indifferent to the suffering of people and he allows himself to be moved by them.


The second trait is the fact of going out to meet people in their actual situations, without fear of danger: the Samaritan woman, Zacchaeus, the fishermen Peter, Andrew, and John, James, Matthew the publican, Nicodemus, the rich young man, the leper, his friends at Bethany, the lame, the man blind from birth, the Gerasene demoniac, Jairus ...

The third trait is his passion for meeting people. As recalled by the Pope in *Evangelii Gaudium* (87, 171, 220, 239), an

encounter permits two lives to dialogue together, influence one another, communicate, to give of oneself to enrich the other.

The fourth trait is consolation/liberation. As a result of the encounter Jesus sometimes heals a sick person and releases the person from a demon, like the man born blind. Elsewhere he heals in the sense that someone who is turned in on himself can come out of himself and trust in others and in God and then everything becomes clear. Thus it was for Peter.

to make them happen. All these good qualities were spotted in Mr Lassalle by the Diocesan Authority. Indeed, his rare intelligence, coupled with exquisite judgment and a serious and sustained modesty, were fully developed through his studies with the Benedictine Fathers, and later with the novitiate of the Doctrinarian Fathers, and were acquired so extensively



However, from 1806, Father Lassalle increased his fortune, through income from paternal property which he managed; he wanted to use this fortune secretly to educate youth and relieve poverty in a permanent way. He also never failed to honor his Superior fees every year and sell for profit any gifts offered to him.

It was, I think, in 1808 or 1809 that he opened a secondary school in Betharram. •• This secondary school is known to •• have gained an honorable reputation.

•• Father Lassalle began and continued his generosity, or at least took care of expens-



es arranging for the Betharram house to receive a portion from the Major Seminaries of Bayonne and Dax, too small for the aspiring of three dioceses. •• The building work was completed in 1814 and the Major Seminary of Betharram was opened in the same year ••. Some distinguished coadjutors came to combine their know-how and efforts to those of Father Lassalle ••. These gentlemen, while fulfilling with zeal the tasks committed to them, never failed to help Father Lassalle, using their utmost ability to increase and arrange the pilgrimages. ••

However on February 17, 1820, the diocese lost its first pastor, Bishop Loyson; but on leaving this Earth, he left to Bétharram more than a treasure; and this treasure was a young Basque man whom he had recruited in 1797, born in Ibarre from poor but religious parents, who lived a pure and simple lifestyle - it was Michael Garicoits.

#### THE FONDEVILLE NOTEBOOK OR BETHARRAM SINCE 1790

Carefully preserved in the archives of the Congregation, the "Fondeville Notebook" points to a signed manuscript written by Pierre Simon Fondeville sci (1805-1872), which gives an account of Betharram's history since the Revolution of 1790. This document, written by one of the first companions of Michael Garicoits, is one of the major sources of the history of Betharram in the nineteenth century and of the foundation of our Congregation. This year, we will present a few excerpts.

From the fourteenth century, a devout chapel in Betharram brought pilgrims to the Virgin. The venerated statue had disappeared in Spain, when Jeanne d'Albret burned her sanctuary at the end of 1569. Restored in 1614, the bishop of Lescar called for Hubert Charpentier to go there in 1632 and he then enlarged the original chapel, built the monastery, erected a crucifix and founded the Congregation of Our Lady of Betharram. Its members, in 1661, completed the present sanctuary and developed the pilgrimage. During the French Revolution their property was confiscated, their actions were stopped and their worship was disturbed. In 1808, after the Concordat, Monsignor Loyson, Bishop of Bayonne, bought Betharram.

## Regarding the arrival of Procope Lasalle, the renewal of Bétharram and the Great Seminary Foundation ...

(NB: We will indicate the presence of deleted passages by the symbol ••)

• Providence, which sent his man<sup>1</sup> to France to restore its worship, sent also by Mary's prayer, a man who had to call people back, by his prudence, patience and charity, to true devotion to Mary and to Jesus crucified, and to bring back hearts to the fountain of supernatural life, the Sacraments. For this it was necessary to revive Christian and ecclesiastical education, banished from the country as a result of the French Revolution; it was necessary to renew the spirit of both genders in the four abolished dioceses: Tarbes, Landes, Lescar and Oloron. •• Mary planted this man in Betharram for 26 years who, according to the wishes of her heart, should carry out the works of mercy she had planned for her chosen country. This man was Mr. Procope Lassalle, a former doctrinarian priest, aged about 45 years. • He was a native of Saint-Pé (diocese of Tarbes, then administered by

the Bishop of Bayonne). He had two brothers and a sister. •• Mr. Procope Lassalle and his elder brother embraced the Institute of Christian Doctrine in Tarbes; his younger brother joined that of the Barnabites at Lescar; his sister became a Carmelite or Dominican. During the Revolution, the three brothers went to hide in the Rouergue ••.

Mr. Procope Lassalle, back from exile, was called in 1806 or 1807 by Monsignor Loyson to take on the management of Betharram. He prepared himself to fulfill the intentions of Our Lady and to resurrect the former works of the Holy House, to arrange pilgrimages, making them honorable and useful, and to create an institution for youth to recruit a sufficient clergy for the four dioceses. •• All these works called for knowledge, great zeal, a lively piety, great resources and great persistence in order

At other times, he comforts, forgiving sinners like Mary Magdalene. Or again he can awaken ardour in the hearts of listeners with his fiery speech as he did with the disciples of Emmaus.

Consolation means more than cure; consolation is discovering that life has meaning because God loves me, even though everything might appear otherwise. If we manage to comfort a sick man, it means help to bear the pain of his illness, relieving the pain of his heart to relieve the body.

Jesus also consoles when around him: 'All were amazed and asked each other: "What is this? This is a teaching with authority"...' (Mk 1: 27) so it is in the Sermon on the Mount, the parables and the teaching on the last judgment.

The fifth trait is the change of heart in the person consoled, liberated and restored to happiness, enthused, committed and joyful; it is then that he knows salvation. He now lives and works with a new spirit, alive in a new way, because he feels a new person.

Such is the experience of salvation in practice: the result of healing and consolation after encountering Jesus. It is also decisive for the people, they feel drawn to him (Mt. 14: 13-14; 15, 32, 18, 16-18; Jn 6: 1-2.). This is what will make them believe that he is the way, the truth and the life, and the light of the world, the bread of life, the bridegroom, the resurrection and the living water.

The Kingdom of God is the essence

of Jesus' teaching. When the encounter happens, and there is a change related to the experience of divine love, then a new way of living human relations is emerging: instead of wounding we become peacemakers; instead of seeing others as enemies we see them as brothers; each of us dependent on God as his sons since he loves us; equal among others because God loves them too. We must make these fundamentals our own because in all things and everywhere, they humanise us and confirm us as gifts of God for those He loves.

This is the secret of the Kingdom: we must lose our life to find it; we mustn't seek to save it at any cost for whatever reason. Serve, love enemies, forgive, give life. May the first among you be the servant of all. He who humbles himself will be exalted. That is why, after having announced the Kingdom of God, Jesus accomplished it by his abasement; by giving his life, his Father could save humanity. Thus he showed his love for God and for men. Jesus, his life, his passion, death and resurrection is the good news; his person, his life and his paschal mystery manifest the Father's love for every single person.

Like in the Garden of Eden, peaceful harmony between man and animal (with the help, however, of some bananas, he said...)



REGION: the ministry with the youth, the missionary pastoral ministry, the ministry in the colleges (fifteen) and in the parishes and the substations (fifteen) urged us to raise some questions



Vicariate of Paraguay: young people are invited for a Vocation Day, twice a year. Some religious are available for spiritual direction: Fr Osmar (formator), Fr Raul, Fr Alberto and Br Sixto. On average, every year there are three postulants (in 2015 there are possibly five). Usually they hail from rural or urban areas.

Vicariate of Brazil: the young people are guided by Fr Eder (formator of the aspirants). He meets their families and their Parish Priests. Fr Jefferson cooperates with the team, keeps contacts through the social networks, etc... Fr Glecimar (formator of the Postulants) guides the young people and organizes the Spiritual Exercises. The seven newly-ordained priests are involved in vocation promotion. On average, every year there are two or three postulants. In 2015 there will be two hailing from parishes of Minas Gerais and of San Paolo.



Vicariate of Argentina-Uruguay: in Argentina we provide personal accompaniment. The young people are small in number but fairly perseverant. On average, every year one young person joins the Postulancy. Fr Daniel and Fr Sebastian along with some other religious or lay persons offer their guidance to college students involved in the missionary pastoral ministry or youth ministry. In Uruguay the missionaries are looking for the "Uruguayan Candidate". God will provide.

The Region relies mainly on the Regional Team for Vocation Promotion and Formation. This group gathers twice a year with the Regional Vicars (Fr Mauro and Fr Daniel, formators) and implements the Regional Project of formation, following to the *Ratio Formations*.

#### Vocation Promotion



Before beginning this round of the formation houses, it is relevant to underline the important work of vocation promotion carried out before the formation.

A vocation can only come from God: woe betide any man who attributes it to himself! But it is necessary to help young people know the voice of God, to make it more recognisable, to strive to overcome obstacles that arise, and what holiness is needed to do that! It is necessary to have a soul and heart empty of the things of earth and filled with God; soul and heart accustomed to hearing his voice so as to distinguish it, amidst the noises that deafen men, then point it out to them and, once known, to help them to accept it in spite of the world and the devil. #### A MESSAGE FROM THE BISHOP OF ROME



The simple words and surprising gestures of Pope Francis are a strong call for all the members of the Church to be more faithful to the Gospel. Let us listen to them once again together!

To usher in this new year, what better than to submit to your attention the outline of the Letter of the pope to the consecrated men and women, of 21 November 2014?

Together let us thank the Father, who called us to follow Jesus by fully embracing the Gospel and serving the Church, and poured into our hearts the Holy Spirit, the source of our joy and our witness to God's love and mercy before the world.

The aims of the year of consecrated life:

- 1. The first of these aims is to look to the past with gratitude.
- 2. This Year also calls us to live the present with passion.
- 3. To embrace the future with hope should be the third aim of this Year.

What in particular do I expect from this Year of grace for consecrated life?

- 1. That the old saying will always be true: "Where there are religious, there is joy".
- 2. I am counting on you "to wake up the world", since the distinctive sign of consecrated life is prophecy.
- 3. So I am hoping that the "spirituality of communion" will become a reality.
- I also expect from you what I have asked all the members of the Church: to come out of yourselves and go forth to the existential peripheries.
- 5. I expect that each form of consecrated life will question what it is that God and people today are asking of them.

In this letter, I wish to speak not only to consecrated persons, but also:

- 1. To the laity, who share with them the same ideals, spirit and mission.
- 2. The whole Christian people to be increasingly aware of the gift which is the presence of our many consecrated men and women, heirs of the great saints who have written the history of Christianity.
- 3. To the consecrated men and women and to the members of fraternities and communities who belong to Churches of traditions other than the Catholic tradition.
- 4. Other expressions of religious fraternity [...]. There are instances, some long-standing, of inter-monastic dialogue involving the Catholic Church and certain of the great religious traditions.
- 5. Finally, in a special way, I address my brother bishops. [...] I ask you, the Pastors of the particular Churches, to show special concern for promoting within your communities the different charisms, whether long-standing or recent. I ask you to do this by your support and encouragement, your assistance in discernment, and your tender and loving closeness to those situations of suffering and weakness in which some consecrated men or women may find themselves. Above all, do this by instructing the People of God in the value of consecrated life, so that its beauty and holiness may shine forth in the Church.

At the beginning of this year, dedicated to the consecrated life, Pope Francis wrote a letter to the Religious, in which he says: "Who has found the Lord and follows him faithfully, is a messenger of the joy of the *Spirit*" (n.6).

The Pope is urging us to renew and deepen the meaning of our vocation with joy and passion. I was ordained as a priest a month ago. Everyday I ask the Lord to

its of their position: in family life, with all the family members that the Lord gives them, in the office, in the firm, in the club, in the political party, in the trade unions, in the NGO's, and in all the other areas of life.

- <sup>6</sup> In everything each one is committed fully, unassumingly, joyfully and generously, each aware that he is where God wants him to be. because this is God's will and in order to do what God wants, eliciting in those around him the inevitable questions of Blessed Paul VI: Why are they like this? Why do they live this way? By whom or by what are they inspired? Why are they among us? (E.N. 21)
- Always, they try to show the reason for their hope that it is Jesus Christ who is filling their lives with joy, so that all can know him, love him and follow him in order to live in the same happiness.
- <sup>8</sup> The Lay Betharramite lives his faith in a mature way, he tries to discern the will of God in all the various circumstances of his life, in order to see in the signs of the times the presence of God (G.S. 1).
- <sup>9</sup> He enriches his personal interior formation by studying the Holy Scriptures, reading St Michael's writings and following Betharramite tradition; he tries to fully understand the social Doctrine of the Church (see Compendium of the social doctrine of the Church).
- 10 When he has the chance, he joins one of the Betharramite communities to help carry

out the mission the Church has entrusted to the Congregation of the Sacred Heart of Jesus of Betharram.

- 11 He lives the Christian life joyfully so as to attract everyone to experience the new life which flows from the Heart of the risen Lord.
- 12 When we think of the married lay Betharramite we realise they have accepted the sacrament of marriage as a joyful gift. They live family life like the newly baptised, accepting their daily crosses and enjoying consolation from the Lord. Their family becomes a "domestic Church" where the family members read the Word of God, take part in the Eucharist, build up unity through Christian love; each one pursuing the good of others. They care for the poor and sympathise with them, respect life and bring up children to follow the Gospel values. In all of this they are witnesses to the love God has for us all and which He has revealed to us in Jesus Christ.
- 13 When thinking of Betharramite lay people who are single or widowed, we realise that they can live their vocation consecrating their life to the Lord by committing themselves to living the evangelical counsels of chastity, poverty and obedience. This would need a private consecration. The lay person who wishes to do it, makes an agreement with a religious of Betharram, who will inform his Regional Vicar and, with his consent, accept the consecration in a small private celebration

## The definition of a Christian lay Betharramite

Should we add a question mark to this heading? In fact, what follows is a text written and suggested by the Superior general, Fr Gaspar Fernandez Perez, to show how to go about defining a betharramite lay person. All are called (cf RoL 3) "to live their baptismal vocation, enlightened by the charism of the Incarnation".

We remember that on 31 May 2011 at Bethlehem, the members of the general Chapter wrote a letter to the laity, in these terms: "The charism of Saint Michael is more than ever alive and can offer a path to Christians wishing to know how to live their faith. Their presence with us in our life and mission is the proof. We thank you for your collaboration, competence and generosity in all that you have done for the formation, mission, and the management of our assets. During our discussions we came to realise the diversity that exists in different countries in the way this spirituality and mission is lived ...

We encourage you to continue to study and deepen the sense of your identity as lay people, and your mission in the Church, as members of the Betharramite family ..."



- Through Baptism, the lay Betharramite lives in union with Jesus, annihilated and obedient, the Word Incarnate who, with the generous impulse of his Heart always says to his Father "Here I am" so as to cooperate in the redemption of mankind through his unceasing service. As followers of Jesus Christ, known, loved, inward looking but following the example of St Michael, all, through their actions and words are missionary-disciples of Jesus.
- <sup>2</sup> The lay members of Betharram foster in their Christian way of life the virtues of the Sacred Heart of Jesus and try to live them in their daily lives. They do everything unassumingly with humility, obedience, commitment, meekness, love and joy.
- They live and build up the community of the Church and join in the life of the Church with the help of the Word of God in the celebration of the Eucharist and other Sacraments, in their unity towards the needy and with a steadfast commitment towards the work of announcing Jesus to all and bringing them the same happiness.
- <sup>4</sup> Among their fellow brothers and sisters, lay Betharramites witness their Christian authenticity and like a grain of yeast transform the world little by little according to the Gospel values, presenting the Kingdom of God to their fellow brothers and sisters.
- <sup>5</sup> They commit themselves, like Jesus, to practice unbounding charity within the lim-

make my vocation new. In the history of each vocation, God himself is the mysterious person who does the calling. As betharramite religious and priest, I am marked by the sign of God's consolation, and in my ministry I am called to bring this consolation to others. This is Pope Francis' desire, expressed in the book of Isaiah too: to bring to all the consolation of God and to be witnesses of his mercy. So, I am called to spread the truth of the Gospel. - to show this particular face of God through our charism, by following in a creative and faithful way what Saint Michael laid down for us in our Rule of Life;
- to bring to all the joy of my personal encountering with the Lord;
- to build up the community with my ten-

derness, in the limits of my position.

As a newly-ordained Betharramite priest, today, this is my dream and my wish for my Congregation: may our Congregation always make the experience of being together around the table (community), because this is the special place to be nourished, to strengthen the bonds and to go to the mission. I pray to the Virgin Mary and to Saint Michael, that they may help me to be faithful to my betharramite vocation.

I had the opportunity to express my gratitude during our Regional Assembly in Paraguay.

At the beginning of my ministry as a priest, I learned how to work in the education field in Saint Michael



College: this helped me to carry out my mission at Dom Helder for 26 years. I expressed my gratitude to the communities for helping me to become a priest: J. the America, S. Domingos, Brumadinho, Santa Luzia, Nova Granada. At Conceição do Rio Verde, near my village, Itanhandu, in the same Basilica where the four of us (Geraldo Luz and João Batista have gone to the Lord before us) were ordained, we thanked our Mother Mary for the blessings received over these 50 years.

ed us in prayer and encouraged us to live more in brotherhood.

- Vicariate Community Celebrations in assemblies of the vicariate ... Here the focus is more on the Betharramite family. These concelebrations effect an encounter between older and younger brothers, coming from very different backgrounds ... The Eucharist brings us together. The Eucharist shows us the Father's love in his Son the Sacred Heart. Here we are not parish or chaplaincy; we are brothers of one family sharing the same Here I am of St Michael. The Eucharist in such encounters helps us forge a greater sense of belonging to our family.
- At Shefamar (near Haifa in Galilee [current residence of the scj community]) on Sundays all three of us concelebrate together. Here the focus is more missionary:
- This is a district with a Muslim and Druze majority. With other Christians, we participate in their festivals where we are very well received. We try to form in our town one single family with a clear link to the Eucharist.
- We live in the context of violence in the Middle East: in our Eucharist, we take care to pray, and encourage prayer for peace and for the persecuted Christians on our doorstep.
- Mass is in Arabic of course, in the land of Jesus, not far from Nazareth where Jesus lived the Incarnation for 30 years.
- -Three of us concelebrating together posed questions to local Christians at first, because they were accustomed to seeing only one priest. We explained that we are a religious community, with different ministries in the parish, in Nazareth, and in Haifa. Concele-

brating in the parish showed that our life is rooted in the Eucharist because we come together to celebrate.

- We are happy to live this Eucharist together, not only to say who we are, but to bring together in one celebration, the life of the parish: it is a witness and at the same time an offering to God of our mission with the people of God.
- the Eucharist continues afterwards with a cup of coffee in the big divan (lounge): we greet, we exchange, we pass a pleasant time together: the Eucharist is there, already, the first spiritual fruit of Eucharistic encounter ...

To concelebrate is to be invited by the Lord to the one table: to let oneself be received and loved. We come to Him with our poverty but also the richness of our encounters and our shared life. The Church is born and reborn in the Eucharist. «With joy you will draw water from the wells of salvation!»

But the most important thing in the Eucharist was not so much our shared lives, but Christ who came to us to

embrace everything in our lives: his love constituted our consecrated community. Concelebration has also been a meaningful time of reconciliation: during a day of recollection we cannot share meaningfully on the needs of our brothers, without becom-

ing vulnerable and reaching out to one another.
