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FEAST OF THE EXALTATION OF THE CROSS

The Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross, celebrated every year on September 14, recalls three historical events: the finding of the True Cross by Saint Helena, the mother of the emperor Constantine; the dedication of churches



built by Constantine on the site of the Holy Sepulchre and Mount Calvary; and the restoration of the True Cross to Jerusalem by the emperor Heraclius II. But in a deeper sense, the feast also celebrates the Holy Cross as the instrument of our salvation. This instrument of torture, designed to degrade the worst of criminals, became the lifegiving tree that reversed Adam's Original Sin. The feast of Exaltation of the Cross is close to the hearts of each Betharramites as our devotion to the Crucifix of Jesus connects with one of our popular traditions that bears witness to three miracles attributed to the Virgin Mary at Betharram.



The miracle dates back to the year 1616. Some peasants from Montaut, not far from Lestelle, were returning after a long hard day of work out in the fields, when a violent wind rose and devastated the hill threatening Betharram. The cyclone beated on the great wooden Cross at the summit. But as soon as it fell on the ground, it was seen completely

surrounded by a hallow of light. The news rapidly spread around the

country, and an immense crowd gathered there coming in procession to the chapel of Betharram to thank God for this prodigy and thus the devotion to the Crucifix developed among the devotees eventually. Years later Hubert Charpentier, a priest architect constructed a monumental Way of the Cross set up above the Sanctuary at the



side of the Betharram hill which still nourishes the pilgrims of Betharram. Whatever may be the historical exactitude, this miracle gives



witness to a fundamental truth that is, Betharram has always been considered as a sacred place, which has nourished faith for many and it still continues to nourish through the Sacred Heart missionaries of Betharram throughout the world.



On 10th Feast day we had Retreat for all the people by Fathers Fr. Clary D' Souza Fr. Harry. Fr. Sagar. And their team. From morning 9.30.am to 12.15 pm we had Retreat and at 12.30 we had feast mass by Rev.Fr. Vincent Pereira. On this we had First holy communion for 18 children. 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Keralaflood2018

As you all know, Kerala is going through the worst time of its history. We are exposed to tumultuous and disastrous flooding which have destroyed both our life and living. All the rivers, streams and lakes were overflowing throughout the states due to heavy rainfall. The shutter of all the 22 dams had been opened and the water rush had washed away the towns and villages on it's flood path. The situation was much more frightening than we could explain. Over 1.5 lakh people were in relief camps and some are still residing there even after the flooding because of rehabilitation issues. Even hospitals were under



water. The count of the lives that we have lost and people missing are still not confirmed yet. The roads, bridges and homes damaged are beyond repair. Rivers

had been spilling over and the hills were crashing down in landslides to thicklypopulated settlements.

Amidst of these constraints, On 15th of August Fr. Enrico Frigerio, Fr. Edwin Manavalan and I were on the way to Santhigram for the Ordination of Fr. Shamon and caught up in between severe landslides. By the providence of God, we were sheltered in an Armed Police Camp of Pynav, Idukki where we spent two days. Though we couldn't make it for the ordination day, we managed to get there on the following day. The news about flood and its consequences have been circulated around the world via virtual media but actual experiences of ours makes us to understand the seriousness of this calamity. While the situation right now isn't as bad as it was in the last few days, the problems are far from over.



Our government and rescue bodies are doing commendable work for saving each and every life, but are facing severe shortage of funds and resources. This has affected the efficiency of the rescue efforts, which also contribute to the increasing death toll. It is estimated unofficially that the cost of disaster can be up to 100 billion

INR, which seems to be a huge fund for our small state. The calamity has left behind a residue of problems. There is an urgent need to look out for water-

borne diseases like jaundice, diarrhoea, typhoid, among others. There is also a high risk of electrocution. People need to stay away from loose wires and see that whenever they go back, their electricity connection is proper and earthed. Another repercussion of the flood is the worm infestation in leafy vegetables. There is also the risk of snake bites and numerous



cases have been reported on these above issues. Let's be united in prayer for all those who were affected by this massive disaster. May our Good Lord strengthen them.
